The economic power of motorsport is generated by more than

1,750 MOTORSPORT EVENTS IN GERMANY EVERY YEAR WITH



This includes 80,000 active participants in motorsport, more than 21,000 volunteers and other club members. The events take place at 596 sports venues throughout Germany, of which more than 370 are owned by the 2,000 motorsport clubs.

is generated by the German motorsport industry every year! In addition to the 1,99bn euros direct sales
volume in the sport, the economic power of
motorsport also has an impact on other branches
of industry. This generates a further 3,35bn euros in
indirect sales volume, for example in the service sector
and the supplier industry.

is generated by German motorsport every year. In addition to the 981m euros in direct value added by the sport, motorsport contributes a further 1,5bn euros indirect added value to the German economy.

After deducting the costs of the goods and services used in motorsport, 981m euros of additional economic value is generated in Germany.

1.99 BN € DIRECT SALES VOLUME IN MOTORSPORT

Of the 1.99bn euros direct sales volume, 1.21bn are attributable to the service sector and 780m euros to production and engineering. This sector alone generates more than 2,500 jobs for highly qualified specialists.
